


















International Code Flags

Flag	Name & Phonetic Pronunciation	Meaning
	Alfa AL-fah	I have a diver down; keep well clear at slow speed.
	Bravo BRAH-voh	I am taking in, discharging, or carrying dangerous cargo. Also hoisted when taking in bunkers.
	Charlie CHAR-lee	"Yes" or "affirmative". Change of Course (Sailing Regatta)
	Delta DELL-tah	I am manoeuvring with difficulty; keep clear.
	Echo ECK-oh	I am directing my course to starboard.
	Foxtrot FOKS-trot	I am disabled; communicate with me.
	Golf GOLF	I require a pilot.
	Hotel hoh-TELL	I have a pilot on board.

	<p>India IN-dee-ah</p>	<p>I am directing my course to port. (International) Round the Ends Starting Rule (Sailing Regatta)</p>
	<p>Juliet JEW-lee-ett</p>	<p>I am on fire and have dangerous cargo; keep clear.</p>
	<p>Kilo KEY-loh</p>	<p>I wish to communicate with you.</p>
	<p>Lima LEE-mah</p>	<p>You should stop your vessel immediately. Come Within Hail or Follow Me (Sailing Regatta)</p>
	<p>Mike MIKE</p>	<p>My vessel is stopped; making no way. Mark Missing (Sailing Regatta)</p>
	<p>November no-VEM-bur</p>	<p>No or negative. Abandonment and Re-sail (Sailing Regatta)</p>
	<p>Oscar OSS-kur</p>	<p>Man overboard.</p>
	<p>Papa pah-PAH</p>	<p>All personnel return to ship; proceeding to sea (In port).</p>
	<p>Quebec kay-BECK</p>	<p>Ship meets health regs; request clearance into port. [Currently in most progressive countries- I have sickness, require a Doctor. Quarantine possible]</p>

	<p>Romeo ROH-me-oh</p>	None. (International)
	<p>Sierra see-AIR-ah</p>	<p>Moving astern. Shorten Course (Sailing Regatta)</p>
	<p>Tango TANG-go</p>	Keep clear; engaged in trawling.
	<p>Uniform YOU-nee-form</p>	You are running into danger.
	<p>Victor VIK-tah</p>	I require assistance.
	<p>Whiskey WISS-kee</p>	I require medical assistance.
	<p>Xray ECKS-ray</p>	<p>Stop carrying out your intentions and watch for my signals. Individual Recall (Sailing Regatta)</p>
	<p>Yankee YANG-kee</p>	<p>I am dragging anchor. Wear Life Jackets (Sailing Regatta)</p>
	<p>Zulu ZOO-loo</p>	<p>I require a tug. 20% Scoring Penalty (Sailing Regatta)</p>

	First substitute First sub (repeater)	Substitute for the first flag in this hoist. Also "repeats" the first flag or series of flags in this hoist General Recall (Sailing Regatta)
	Second substitute Second sub (repeater)	Substitute for the second flag in this hoist. Also "repeats" the second flag or series of flags in this hoist
	Third substitute Third sub (repeater)	Substitute for the third flag in this hoist. Also "repeats" the third flag or series of flags in this hoist
	Pennant one PEN-ant WUN	Numeral one.
	Pennant two PEN-ant TOO	Numeral two.
	Pennant three PEN-ant TREE	Numeral three.
	Pennant four PEN-ant FOW-er	Numeral four. Postponement (Sailing Regatta)
	Pennant five PEN-ant FIFE	Numeral five.
	Pennant six PEN-ant SICKS	Numeral six.
	Pennant seven PEN-ant SEV-en	Numeral seven.
	Pennant eight PEN-ant ATE	Numeral eight
	Pennant Nine PEN-ant NIN-er	Numeral nine
	Pennant zero PEN-ant ZEE-roh	Numeral zero
